## CHECKLIST OF ITEMS TO BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL

Jesuit Memorial College instils in its students the values of **simplicity and decency**. Parents are expected to promote these same values to their children when procuring the items listed below. Every item should be in good condition and reasonably durable. Medical alerts and approved wrist watches are the only items to be worn on the wrist while in school. All items should be boldly and neatly tagged with the full name of the student.

Students are expected to bring to school when resuming for the term only the items listed below. After resumption, parents are welcome to bring items to school for students through the Vice Principal (Student Life). If, at any time in school, a student is found with any item not on this list, that item will be confiscated and the student punished. **Confiscated items are not returned to students or their parents but are recorded and given to the poor.**

1. 1 water bottle
2. 2 small padlocks
3. 1 Oxford Advanced Learners Dictionary (Latest edition)
4. 12 pens, 12 pencils, 2 rulers (30 cm), 1 set of mathematical instruments, 1 pair of scissors
5. 1 Bible (Revised Standard Version)
6. 1 treated mosquito net (8 feet by 4 feet)
7. 2 white bed sheets (8 feet by 4 feet)
8. 2 white pillow cases (These should have flaps for tucking in.)
9. 1 bedspread (This should be in the colour of the student's school house. *See above.*)
10. 1 covering cloth, 1 light blanket
11. 2 small combs, 1 set of barbing clippers, 1 hairbrush
12. 1 house coat
13. 2 medium-sized towels
14. 2 medium-sized plastic buckets (These should be in the colour of the student's house. *See above.*)
15. 1kg of laundry detergent, 8 bars of soap
16. 12 clothing hangers, 24 clothing pegs
17. Toiletries (Tissue papers will be supplied by the school. Perfume is NOT allowed.)
18. 1 electric pressing iron with 3-pin plug (It must be 3-pin plug.)
19. 1 pair of bathroom slippers
20. 1 pair of black leather shoe
21. 2 pairs of black leather sandals (*See below for specifications and samples*)
22. 1 tin of black shoe polish (not liquid), 1 shoe brush
23. 1 pair of canvas shoes or sneakers

24. 6 pairs of white socks, 2 pairs of socks in the colour of the student's school house (*See above.*)
25. 6 handkerchiefs
26. 2 pairs of pyjamas (or night dresses)
27. 1 set of social outfits, 1 set of traditional attire. 1 special outfit for Cultures Day celebration.
28. 1 raincoat (or umbrella)
29. **For boys:** 2 black belts (3cm wide), 8 white singlets, 8 underpants
30. **For girls:** 8 chemises, 5 tights, 12 underpants, 6 brassieres, 2 pairs of small stud earrings (They should be gold- or silver-plated)
31. **For students who are Catholics:** 1 Rosary, 1 Sunday missal, 1 weekday missal
32. **For students who use eyeglasses:** 2 pairs of eyeglasses. They should have unbreakable lenses and strong frames. Tinted or photo-chronic lenses are not allowed.
33. **For students who are runners:** 1 pair of spike/running shoes
34. **For students who play soccer:** 1 pair of soccer boots
35. **For girls who are athletes:** 2 sports brassieres

### **Specification and Samples of School Sandals**

The sandals should be made of durable material, black all round and with rough soles for friction. They should have open top and parallel straps with none crossing. They should also have ankle straps and buckles but no visible branding. Please see below for samples of approved school sandals.



### **Contraband Items**

1. Anything edible
2. Belt with large or overly styled buckles
3. Cash
4. Clothing that is sleeveless, with mono-strap or spaghetti straps
5. Clothing that is transparent, too tight or revealing of cleavage, armpit, curves or belly
6. Computer, telephone, smart watch, camera, video game, iPad, iPod, scientific calculator with games, electronic toy, organiser, CD player
7. Eyeglasses with tinted or photo-chronic lens
8. Fabric conditioner
9. Food supplement
10. Indecent or age-inappropriate book/literature
11. Jewellery, bangle, wristband, other such item of fashion
12. Perfume, body spray, aerosol
13. Skirt or gown that is above kneecap
14. Spray starch
15. Torch, reading lamp
16. Unapproved clothing
17. Unapproved footwear
18. Wrist watch with a metallic band
